
The Perversion of the Lord's Table (vv. 18-22)

THE LORD'S TABLE IS TO BE IMPARTED TO ALL THE SAINTS (V. 23A)

THE LORD'S TABLE IS TO COMMEMORATE THE LAST SUPPER (VV. 23B-25)
